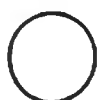
### Official Ballot for State Senator, House of Representatives and County Officers

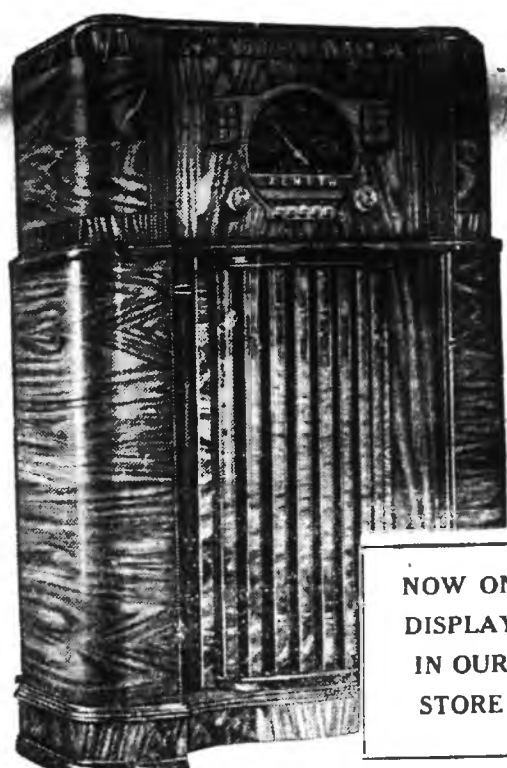
