Holiday Death Toll Is Over 500

Death came to at least 415 persons over the three-day holiday ending last night and as usual, the automobile was the biggest taker of lives.

Forty-five states reported one or more violent deaths over the long period beginning with Independence day, the Associated Press survey showed, but in Rhode Island, Nevada and South Dakota, no fatalities were reported.

Traffic fatalities numbered at least 333 but the toll was far below the estimated 475 the national safety council had predicted in a pre-holiday forecast.
