What would you buy? That's a question that hundreds of thousands of Southern cotton growing families are going to go into huddles over this year.

Because lots of families will be going to market this year with their extra \$25.00 worth of Cotton Stamps, we have pulled together here, from the expert research and observations of the Bureau of Home Economics, some rules anyone can go by in selecting some of the many different kinds of cotton good most families need.

Cotton Fabrics: Fiber: Judge the fiber by unravelling a yarn and pulling out the little fibers making up the yarn. Short fibers vary from a half to one inch in length. Compare the fibers of different cotton fabrics. Best fabrics have the longest fibers.

Finish: Sometimes excessive sizing put in to make a fabric look better than it is can be exposed by rubbing a corner of the fabric between the fingers and noticing if a tell-tale powdery substance filters down.

PCA Is Making Many Farm Loans

Paul J. Vestal, President, Comments On Growth of Production Credit

Farmers and stockmen in Wilkes county have helped to increase the loan volume of the Winston-Salem Production Credit Association during the first six months of the year, according to Paul J. Vestal, President of the Board of Directors of this farmers' cooperative credit organization.

Reporting \$136,944.20 loaned during the first six months of the year, Mr. Vestal said a good share of it went to finance seasonal operations of Wilkes county farmers, stockmen, and growers.

Since the Winston-Salem Association began operations in 1934 it has loaned \$945,012.20 to finance the needs of the members in Alleghany, Ashe, Caldwell, Davidson, Forsyth, Stokes, Surry, Watkings, Wilkes, and Yadkin counties.

Auto Dealers To Meet On July 20

Raleigh.—Automobile dealers of North Carolina will gather for their annual convention in Asheville at the Grove Park Inn on July 20 to 23, this year faced by vital problems which affect all the motorists of the state as profoundly as the dealers themselves.

The federal government plans to double its tax on new car sales; to do likewise with its levy on accessories, tires and tubes; to place a "use" tax of \$5.00 on every privately owned motor vehicle, shiny new or in the last stages of decrepitude; and, in general, to attempt to limit both price and production of automobiles.

Chrysler Percentage Gain Now Highest

According to figures published by Automotive News, registrations of Chrysler cars in the first five months of 1941 showed the largest percentage of gain among the 10 leading makes.

In these five months, Chrysler showed a unit gain in registrations of 67 per cent. This percentage was exceeded by only one manufacturer of relatively limited production (considerably less than half of Chrysler's).
