"The safe way to buy a used car," he continued, "is through an established dealer. No car should be bought without a 'road test.' It is also important to read carefully the contract if the car is being purchased on an installment basis."

The A.A.A. club executive listed the following "danger signals" in used car buying:

Hood that won't fit may be due to accident that has sprung

the frame of the car. Tires on front wheels badly cupped indicate wheels out of

Lights go dim when starter is used indicate battery in bad condition.

Engine clattery when first tarted indicates sloppy pistons.
Inability to idle in high gear tarted indicates sloppy pistons.

Oak Grove-Mrs. Pearl Cooke inder 10 miles en hour indicates uneven compression in engine or Sherman, Mrs. Addie H. Jones. need of tune-up.

Puff of smoke from exhaust when accelerating after long idle indicates worn piston rings, pistons and cylinders.

Tires regrooved into the cords indicate danger and expense
