

### Ship Lands In Tent Camp

Raleigh, Nov. 10.—Second Lieutenant H. P. Taylor was in command of an undisclosed number of unlisted men were injured when an A-24 dive bomber, one of the army's latest types, crashed into a tent camp about half a mile north of the high airport. The plane burst into flames and set fire to several tents. The camp was established here several days ago by the 26th Airbase group in connection with the Carolinas' maneuvers.

Taylor was an air corps reserve officer. He was with the eighth squadron, third bombardment group, out of Savannah, Ga. His home address was not immediately determined.

the governed; a democracy in a Republic; a sovereign Nation of many sovereign states; a perfect Union, one and inseparable; established upon those principles of freedom, equality, justice, and humanity for which American patriots sacrificed their lives and fortunes. I therefore believe it is my duty to my Country to love it; to support its Constitution; to obey its laws; to respect its flag; and to defend it against all enemies."

The duty of defending this Nation against all enemies is a duty for each and every one of us, and for the soldier. It means being prepared to fight and to meet cheerfully all the trials and tribulations of the training necessary to this end. That is what we are here for. To learn how to do our jobs. We expect to make mistakes from time to time. If we were perfect, it would not have been necessary to spend the time or money on these maneuvers. I have this to tell you in regard to your attitude—it has been excellent. You have the spirit that insures success. Don't be afraid to admit your mistakes. If you profit by them, it merely means that you are wiser today than you were yesterday. Be alert, learn to play the game and be aggressive. Keep in mind the proud record of accomplishment established by all those who have preceded you. Consider how much they have done so that you and your fellows could enjoy the benefits of freedom and independence. And be resolved that in their memory and for your future and the future of America, our Army shall be the strength and ready to carry out the policy which shall keep us free forever.

### 2,675,373,000 Bushel Corn Crop Forecast

Washington, Nov. 10.—The Agriculture department reported today that this year's corn crop is 2,675,373,000 bushels, based on November 1, conditions.

Corn production was forecast at 2,625,502,000 bushels a month ago. Production was 2,440,200,000 bushels last year, and the 1930-39 average was 2,307,452,000 bushels.

The crop reporting board made no change in its preliminary estimate of a month ago on this year's wheat crop placed at 961-

194,000 bushels, of which 644,000,000 bushels is winter wheat and 270,228,000 bushels spring wheat, including 44,800,000 bushels of durum. Nor was any change made in the preliminary estimate of 1,138,843,000 bushels for this year's oats crop.

A soybean loan program designed to aid the orderly marketing of a 1941 crop stimulated to record proportions to meet defense needs has been announced by the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Boston, Nov. 10.—Blonde 15-year-old Stella Krupinski, the youngest senior in the South End girls' high school, skipped classes today and was found shot to death in a boy friend's apartment.

The youth, George Blagit, 21, a plumber's helper, reported the shooting to police himself and was quoted by Police Captain Francis M. Tiernan as saying that he shot the girl in a "fit of anger," after a quarrel over her going to a dance with another fellow. Tiernan said Blagit would be arraigned Wednesday on charge of murder.
