198 Farmers Will Get Certificates Food Production

Food and Feed Production Certificates To Be Award-Wednesday Afternoon

SNIPES, Conty Agent In ctarly spring of 1941 a Home Food and Feed guide was mailed to each farm family in the county stating that a contest would be staged among the farm families in North Carolina. This guide contained an outline for the necessary food and feed for a family of five and stated that it would like to have all the formers who thought they could produce as much as 75 per cent of the food and feed on the farm enter the contest. 1100 cards were returned to the county agent's office stating that they desired to participate in the pro-

It is true that the weatherman was against us in that we had a very irregular zeason which made it hard to accomplish our desires. However when the score cards were mailed the first of January. 500 were returned and graded. Out of the 400 there were 198 who qualified for a certificate, according to the rules se up.
