

TRANSPORTATION INVENTORY— Truck Owners Asked To Register Trucks With The War Department

Several weeks ago a request was sent out from the state capital to all truck owners to register their trucks according to a request from the war department.

To date the registration of trucks has been far from complete and a majority of truck owners are being asked to register their trucks.

The registration of trucks is a part of a vast transportation inventory being conducted by the war department, which stresses the importance of such an inventory for use in the interest of national defense.

Names of the truck owners who have not registered have been sent to the Wilkes office of Civilian Defense, along with a supply of registration cards.

The convenience of truck registration has been announced by the war department office located on the second floor of the Bank of North Wilkesboro building.

PROTECTOR SAYS
Trout Season To Open April 15th
Howe Brookshire, Wilkes county game protector, calls attention to the open trout season April 15-August 31, with the exception of Basin Creek, which is in Basin Park. Trout season in Basin Creek will be open May 15-June 30. Bag limit on all species of trout is twelve per day, minimum size seven inches.

This closed season on all other species of game fish is from April 15 to June 16, inclusive. This does not include fishing in the Yadkin River for coarse fish as this stream is open the year around for coarse fishing.

Russian Army Is Near Smolensk
London.—The Russian armies of the center were reported to have forced the heavily fortified Upper Dnieper river in a major flanking movement designed to cut off and destroy the German Rabev-Gzhatek Vyazma salient before Moscow, the last enemy line of consequence standing east of Smolensk.

The crossing, said Soviet advisers via Stockholm, was made between the towns of Dorogobuzh and Durovo about 50 miles northeast of Smolensk and at about the point where the Moscow-Smolensk railway bridges the Dnieper.

Army Recruiters Coming Two Days
Mobile Unit Will Be At The Town Hall Monday and Tuesday, April 13, 14

The United States Army battle cry is "Keep 'em Flying." Today we are building an American air force that will have no equal in planes or personnel. The United States Army needs thousands of young men to apply each month for the world's finest aviation training as aviation cadets.

Commissioners as second lieutenants are waiting for those at the end of seven and one-half months training. If you have reached your 18th birthday and are not yet 27, you are eligible under the new regulations for cadet training. Good physical condition is required. Married or single men are now eligible. Diplomas or credits are not required from educational institutions for training as bombardiers, navigators and pilots of the Army Air Corps.

Application blanks for aviation cadet training may be obtained from the United States Army Mobile Recruiting Unit, which will be located at the town hall building, North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, on Monday and Tuesday, April 13 and 14, and applicants will be referred to the nearest Aviation Cadet Examining Board for the necessary physical and mental examination. Complete information on other branches of the Army may also be obtained at this unit. Young men 18 and 19 years of age are especially needed for enlistment for aviation cadet and regular army training. These men are urged to visit this unit on the above dates.

"Let's Go! U. S. A. Keep 'em Flying!"
This unit will also be in Boone, N. C., Wednesday and Thursday, April 15 and 16.
