## COATES PRESIDES— District Defense School Is Held In Wilkesboro 12th Representative Of Civilian Defense Organizations In Ten Counties Attend

Civilian defense officials of 10 northwestern North Carolina counties attended a civilian defense school in Wilkesboro Tuesday. Albert Coates, of Chapel Hill, director of the Institute of Government, opened the meeting Tuesday morning. There were 55 in attendance from the following counties: Ashe, Alleghany, Watauga, Avery, Caldwell, Iredell, Alexander, Burke, Wilkes and Surry counties. Mr. Coates, who presided at the morning and afternoon sessions, gave the background for the civilian defense organization at the opening session and explained the various branches of the defense set-up. In the afternoon Roy Kane, co-ordinator of the civilian defense organization in Elkin, explained the defense setup there, and following his talk was a general discussion of problems which had confronted civilian defense councils in the various counties.

groceries came along a short while later and headed for the same store at night a more thorough investigation was made. Some confessions have been made. Sergeant Ingie said, and the facts disclosed indicate that a large amount of wholesale groceries and notions have been stolen and sold, and in some instances to merchants who should have

known that the goods were stolen. According to comment by highway patrol officer, some of the men involved were employed by delivering in wholesale lots from the two wholesale firms mentioned. And one man was to place on the truck merchandise which had not been billed out. This suggests they sold themselves, often at night to merchants who cooperated and who in some instances received the goods at from 5 to 55 per cent discount. Complete results of the investigation will be made known when it is completed and arrests of all persons found to be involved are made. Sergeant Ingie said.
