Kincheloe Tells  
Club of Handicaps**

**Baptist Pastor Addresses  
Club On "Personal Handi-  
caps and Social Progress"**

Dr. John W. Kincheloe, Jr., pastor of the First Baptist church, addressed the North Wilkesboro Kiwanis Club Friday noon on the subject of "Personal Handicaps and Social Progress".

The speaker cited a long list of persons who forged ahead and were successful despite handicaps. Some of those listed were as follows:

A blind girl in the post office in a South Carolina town; Helen Keller, blind, deaf and dumb; President Theodore Roosevelt, weak body and injured eye; John Milton, blind; Alexander Pope, a weak, frail body; Lord Byron, club foot; R. L. Stevenson, tuberculosis; Bethoven, deaf; Thomas Edison, poor hearing.

The list of those handicapped by poverty; Mozart, extremely poor; Michael Pupin, came to America penniless; Madam Curie, poor.

The list of those handicapped by accident: Orison Marden, his manuscripts burned; Thomas Carlyle, his manuscripts burned.

The list of those who had great opposition: The Wright Brothers; Robert Fulton, and Napoleon.

Those who became inspired while in prison: O'Henry, Sir Walter Raleigh, John Bunyan, the Apostle Paul, and Cervantes.

"It just seems like some people have to be handicapped to give to us the blessings they do. We have had marvelous inventions because of those handicapped people. We do owe a great debt to them," the speaker said.

At the meeting Friday G. H. Sluss, of Bluefield, W. Va., was a visiting Kiwanian and Ben F. Estes was a guest of J. C. Reins.

**Dr. Wm. C. Tate

Banner Elk. — Dr. William Cummings Tate, prominent physician of Banner Elk, has been elected to the presidency of the Edgar Tufts Memorial Association, the position left vacant by the death of Edgar H. Tufts on June 15 of this year. He will take up his new duties immediately.

The Association consists of Lees-McRae College, Grace Hospital, Grandfather Home for Children, and various allied enterprises.

Dr. Tate has been chief-of-staff of Grace Hospital since 1910. Until the death of the Rev. Edgar Tufts, its founder, in 1923, Dr. Tate was his associate, and since that time he has been a co-worker with Edgar Tufts, the son. No one person is more familiar with the work of the Association, with the problems of the mountain people, and the close relationship of the two.
