## Doctors' Night Rates Increased

Revised Rates Designed To Discourage Unnecessary Night Calls To Homes

Wilkes County Medical Society has revised the rates for physicians' house calls and for office calls.

The revised rates are as follows: day office visits, \$2; night office visits (after six p. m.) \$4; day house calls in town, \$3; night house calls in town \$5; out of town same as in town plus 50 cents per mile.

Purpose of the revised rates is to discourage unnecessary night calls and calls outside of the physicians' offices since the number of physicians has been decreased by calls into the armed service and the remaining physicians are overburdened with work. The revised rates are in line with those being charged elsewhere in the state where the number of physicians has been greatly reduced.

## 220 Billions For the War Appropriated

Washington.—A Treasury compilation showed yesterday that appropriations and contract authorizations for the war program now total more than \$220,000,000,000.

Although this sum is larger than all the money spent by the United States government from the inauguration of George Washington as President until the attack on Pearl Harbor, most of it remains to be spent.

Treasury expenditures during the period—March 25, 1940, when spending for the war program began, until July 31, 1942—total \$37,000,000,000 for military purposes. An additional billion or two has been spent by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation and other government corporations for which no exact figures are available.

## Hay Mixtures

For the past several springs we have been having a drought, therefore, it is a good idea for our farmers to seed a hay mixture now in order to have some hay to tide you over any drought that we might have.

Mixtures of small grains and winter legumes make bigger yields of hay than do single crops; and the hay is better balanced in nutrients and more palatable.

The mixtures given below should be seeded the first of September.
