Henderson Promises For All Essential Car Uses

U.S. To Attempt To Provide Tires For Every Auto

trator Leon Henderson announced officially for the first time Saturday night that the government will attempt to provide tires for essential usage of every automobile in the nation.

But his announcement was accompanied by a stern warning that both tires and gasoline will be denied to motorists who violate provisions of a five-point program for nation-wide mileage

OPA officials advise the nation's 27,900,000 motorists, furthermore, that Henderson's statement does not promise tires for everybody. Rather, "that's only what we hope to do," they explained.

5-Point Program

"I. Rationing of used tires and provide as far as possible the minimum essential mileage to and Scott Field, Ill. each of the nation's passenger

"2 Actual control of each car's mileage through the rationing of gasoline (scheduled to start November 22) to prevent unnecessary driving as far as possible. and to hold the national average with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. C down to 5,000 miles per car per

Compulsory periodic in spection of ail tires to guard against abuse and to prevent wear beyond the point where they can be repaired.

Violators Lose Rights

"4. Denial of gasoline and tire replacements to cars whose drivers persistently violate the national 35-mile-an-hour speed him it for rubber conservation. (Officials said such denials will be applied, through other regulations, to all phases of the program.)

"5. Capacity use, through car sharing, of every car on every trip so far as possible.


