## Resolution Calling For Primary And Election For The Town of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina

(Advertisement)  
At a meeting duly called of the Board of Elections for Wilkes County on motion duly seconded and carried, it is hereby ordered that the primary for the Town of North Wilkesboro to nominate Mayor, Members of the Town Board of Commissioners and School Trustees for said Town be held on Monday, April 19th, 1943, and that the election shall be held on Tuesday, May 4th, 1943. Upon motion duly seconded and carried Monroe Eller was appointed Registrar and Glenn Cox and J. B. Norris were appointed judges, to hold said Municipal Election and Primary for the Town of North Wilkesboro, and that said Primary and Election shall be conducted and carried on under the laws governing Town Primaries and Elections for the Town of North Wilkesboro.

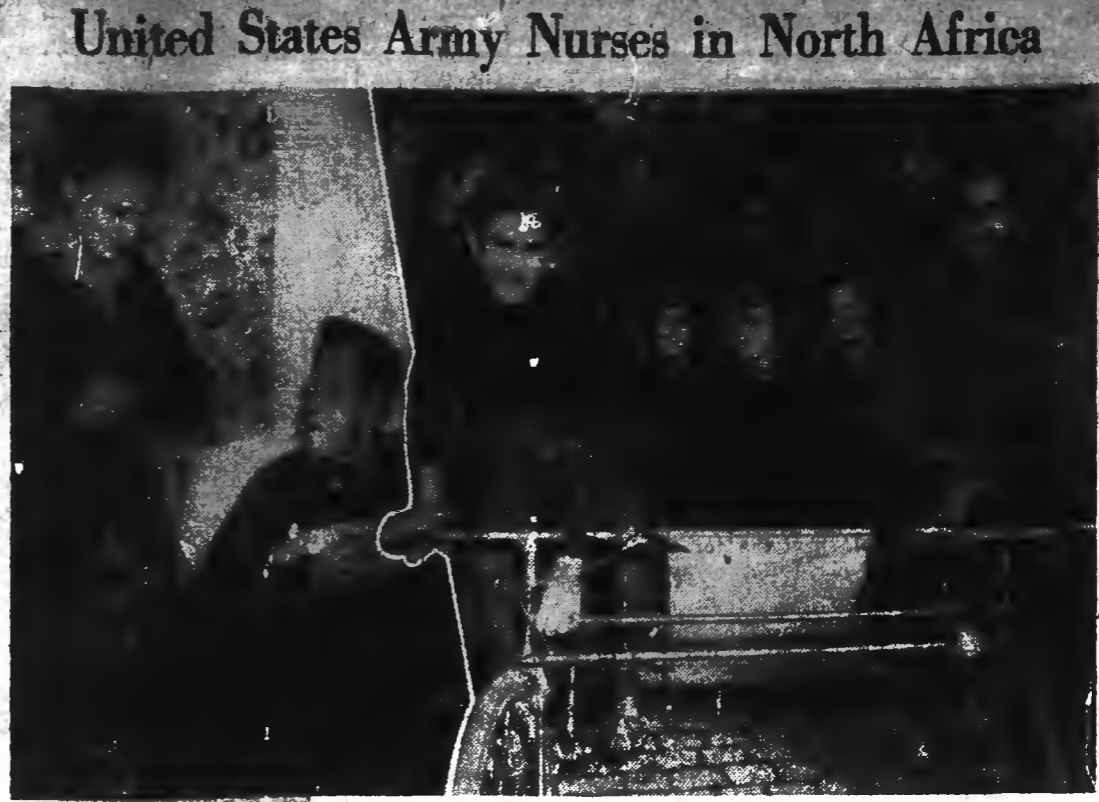

## ODT TO CHANGE RATION SYSTEM

Washington—The system of granting temporary ration rations to commercial motor vehicle operators will be discontinued, the Office of Defense Transportation announced yesterday.  
The system has made it possible for operators to obtain additional rations from local boards pending determination of their appeals for additional allotments.  
ODT said the system was being discontinued because of the small number of appeals. In the future, ODT district offices will pass on such requests as promptly as possible, the agency said.
