Flying Forts Hit 77 Planes In Base Raid

Allied Headquarters in North Africa.—The Allied high command announced yesterday a stunning 83-to-3 aerial victory which shredded Marshal Rommel's sky cover and further menaced his thin supply line on the eve of the climatic fight for survival by his cornered Tunisian troops.

American Flying Fortresses led a tremendous assault on Rommel's rear bases in Sicily, destroying 77 planes. Seven more were shot down in other operations during Tuesday.

Heavy German reliance on aerial transports indicated the gravity of Rommel's supply problem as Allied ground troops closed on enemy's last mountain bastions.

"ONCE-OVER"
