

the is larged to see that this purce if fully tapped. From the drippings of sausage, steaks, and chops, beef, pork and lamb roasts must come fat for glycerine so needed to make the explosives for the hells and bombs and depth charges to win the war.

Strein the fat through an orlinari strainer into a clean, smooth-edged can and store in a cool dark place or a refrigerator untly you have a pound. Then carry it to your butcher or grocer from whom you purchase your ment, and he will pay you three conts per pound for it.

Solid fat can be salvaged by utting it through a meat grinder nd then heating it in the top part of a double boile: or in a small amount of water in the frying pan. No amount of waste fat is too mell to save. One tablespoonful a lay will mean almost one pound per month, and this should oe possible in every household in the state if the housewife will use a little less for seasoning in order to back up the boys in the armed forces.

households 200,000,000 pounds per year, or 16,677,000 pounds per month.

Every housewife in North Caroing is asked to do her part-one half pound per family per month. Are you doing your part?



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## Of Good Feeding

Milk production of North Caroina dairy herds oin be greatly increased through proper care and feeding, says J. A. Arev, dairy extension specialist at N. C. State College.

Years of herd improvement as sociation work in the state have conclusively shown that unprofitable production of many cows is due to poor feed and care, rather than to a lack of the inherited ability to produce milk.

Arey cited the records of eleven mature Jersey cows which were on test at Willard. With a medium feed allowance, which was better than that received by other nearby herds, they produced an average of 4.240 pounds of milk and 206 bounds of fat per year. Later, these same cows were given a full ration of similar feeds. but in different proportions, and the average production jumped to 7,125 pounds of milk and 352 pounds of fat per year.

Although more feed was consumed during the second period, the cost of producing one hundred pounds of milk was 27 percent less, points out Arey, and this was due to the increase in milk production.

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The specialist spid that if all North Carolina dairy cows were given a full feed ration and a resulting increase milk production obtained like that in the test at Willard, the average North Carolina cow would produce 269 pounds of fat rather than 159 pounds, and North Cerolinia would add 42,138,600 pounds of butterfat this year to meet increasing war needs.
