ORDINANCE
BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, in regular session assembled:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, licensed to sell beer and or wine in the Town of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, to sell or offer for sale any beer and or wine in the Town of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, between the hours of 11:30 p. m. on Saturday night and 7:00 a. m. Monday morning.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, licensed to sell beer and or wine in the Town of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, to permit or allow the consumption of any beer and or wine in any place in said town, under the control of or being operated by said licensee, between the hours of 12:00 midnight Saturday and 7:00 a. m. Monday.

Section 3. Should any part or section of this Ordinance be declared invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder thereof shall not be affected thereby but shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. That all ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after October 1st, 1945.
