WILKES YOUTH KILLED

BY A HIT-RUN DRIVER (Continued from page one) after he stepped from a city bus near his home around midnight Thursday night, but that his unconscious form was not discovered until early Friday morning.

Hospital attendants said his injuries included skull fracture and concussion, fractures of both legs and a severe chest injury. He was still unconscious shortly before he

The youth was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Burcham of State Road. His father is a departmental foreman at Chatham Manufacturing Company here.

Authorities reported the accident occurred within a stone's throw of the Burcham home shortly after midnight, but that the family had retired. Kyle Thompson, a resident of the community, discovered the unconscious lad as he was driving out from his home Friday morning.

Young Burcham reportedly was returning to his home after attending a local threatre when the accident occurred. A wide search for the driver of the car was launched by police and sheriff's officers but had yielded no trace of his identity late yesterday.

Funeral service was held today at Mount Pleasant church.
