Wounded Marine Wanting Letters

The following letter has been received by the Wilkes unit of the American Legion Auxiliary:

"Dear Friends:

"I am writing the screwiest request you have ever received, I guess. I have just come back from foreign service and will be here for at least six months, trying to regain my health.

"I get mighty lonesome lying here day after day, and when the other boys get back it makes me feel worse as I don't have any people to write me. Before I enlisted in the U. S. Marine corps 13 years ago I was around North Wilkesboro a lot, so I thought you might know someone who would like to correspond with me. It doesn't matter whether they are male or female or what age. I will try to answer all.

"Time passes so slowly here. I lie here flat on my back and I ask what time it is and when it seems as if I have waited two hours I'd ask again and it has only been ten minutes. So you see a letter could help a lot. I am 33 years old, five feet nine inches tall, have blue eyes and brown hair and weigh around 150 pounds.

"As I am flat on my back, please excuse this writing. I have ink and cigarette ashes all over my sheets. It is mighty awkward trying to write lying down.
