

### Points To Watch In Saving Tractor Fuel

Much fuel can be saved if the tractor is kept in good condition, necessary adjustments are made, and the machine properly operated, reports J. D. Brinkley, Extension agricultural engineer at N. C. College.

"In these times when national needs for fuel are great, saving is a vitally important matter," he says.

To help save fuel and maintain peak tractor operation, he offers several good suggestions. The spark plugs and ignition should be carefully checked, being sure that they are correct for the engine and the fuel to be burned. Also, carburetors, manifolds, governors, and shocks should be checked for proper operation.

In making adjustments, shut off the motor because an idling tractor consumes large amounts of fuel. Correct lubrication reduces friction to a minimum and saves on power and fuel. Overheating the engine results in loss of efficiency and also a large loss of fuel.

Correctly inflated tires reduce draft and rolling resistance, and help to save on fuel.

Poor hitch creates unnecessary draft and the pulling of dead weight. This calls for extra power and fuel.

The brakes should be kept properly adjusted. A dragging brake is just so much dead weight and a real fuel hog.

Operate the tractor slowly at first. A throttle which is advanced too rapidly pours fuel through the engine faster than it can be burned into useful work. Fast starts throw dangerous strains on the moving parts of the tractor and the tools which it pulls.

### B. and L. Payments \$4,100,000 in 1943

#### Distribution of \$1,200,000 Made During Last Six Months

Distribution of \$1,200,000 of earnings for the last six months of 1943 to members of the 174 Building, Savings, and Loan Associations of the state was completed by January 1st, it is announced by the North Carolina Building and Loan League.

Crosby B. Miller, of Albemarle, president of the league, said this brings to \$4,100,000 total dividends paid by these home financing institutions in 1943.

About 220,000 separate dividend checks or credits are involved in the distribution, Miller pointed out, which indicates a substantial number of institutional investors are receiving this year's end the first dividend from a Building, Savings, and Loan Association. Although there has continued throughout the year a restriction of building of homes, which has been severely reducing the lending volume of the institutions, Miller states, investors, who are planning ahead for home ownership, are most welcome by the associations.

"This year's dividend will help pay for the War effort by several different uses to which it will be put," said President Miller. In the main the bulk of the payments will be on regular savings or investment shares accounts in the associations. On the savings accounts, the dividends will be credited and will flow back into the same uses to which the regular capital of the institution is directed. During the year the associations purchased in excess of \$15,000,000 in war bond issues.

Dividends paid in cash in a great many cases will be used to increase the individual War Bond holdings.

The North Wilkesboro Building & Loan Association, of North Wilkesboro, and Wilkesboro Building & Loan Association, of Wilkesboro, substantially participated in the dividend distribution, and the purchase of War Bonds for their own portfolio.

### State College Hints To Farm Homes

Small scratches on furniture often disappear if they are rubbed with nut meats. The oil in the nuts darkens and conceals the scratch. An oily nut like a pecan or butternut is best. Cut the kernel with a knife and rub the cut side into the scratch. Then polish the surface of the wood with a soft dry cloth. A mixture of two-thirds linseed oil and one-third turpentine is also good for rubbing scratches out of sight, as is a reliable commercial furniture polish.

Serve chopped, leftover poultry meat, creamed and hot on toast as a pie, topped with biscuit rounds, or with mashed potato, rice, noodles, or spaghetti. To make it turkey or chicken a la king, give it richer sauce with egg yolks added, and perhaps mushrooms and some leftover peas or string beans.

Or, mix bits of poultry meat with mashed potatoes. Shape into cakes and brown in a little fat for a tasty lunchtime dish.

Mix leftover stuffing with bits of poultry meat or gravy, and brown to make well-flavored hash. Or, mix stuffing, leftover meat, and gravy, all three, and brown in the oven for a scallop.

Try frozen custards as a nutritious and delicious wartime ice cream. Whole egg and egg yolks combined with cream, top milk, half and half, whole milk or evaporated milk make delightful and economical frozen custard desserts for use in the home.

This method of making custards is simple. The procedure is to beat the eggs slightly and then add the sugar or sweetening and stir until blended. Add liquid and blend thoroughly. If the liquid is heated and then poured gradually over the beaten eggs, with constant stirring, the time of cooking is shortened.

For frozen custards, cook to desired consistency; cool; pour into pan; and place in the freezing unit. In three hours time you will have a grand wartime ice cream.
