## CHERRY FAVORS PAYING DEBT, HELPING VETERANS, RAISING PAY AND REDUCTION OF TAXES

A fiscal program which will adequately support operations of North Carolina's public education system and other State activities, provide for contingencies, insure liquidation of present general fund indebtedness from the existing revenue surplus, keep North Carolina's budget balanced and reflect remaining surplus in tax reductions, was advocated here Friday by Major Gregg Cherry, of Gastonia, candidate for Governor, in an address to North Wilkesboro civic clubs.

Major Cherry spoke at noon to the Kiwanis Club and at 7 p. m. to the Lions Club.

"I have served the State of North Carolina in good times and bad and have had the experience of dealing with the problem of meeting the financial needs of the State in both depression and prosperity", declared Major Cherry, a member of the State Legislature continuously since 1931, in his address to the Kiwanis Club, in which he discussed the state's financial structure and fiscal outlook for the future.
