



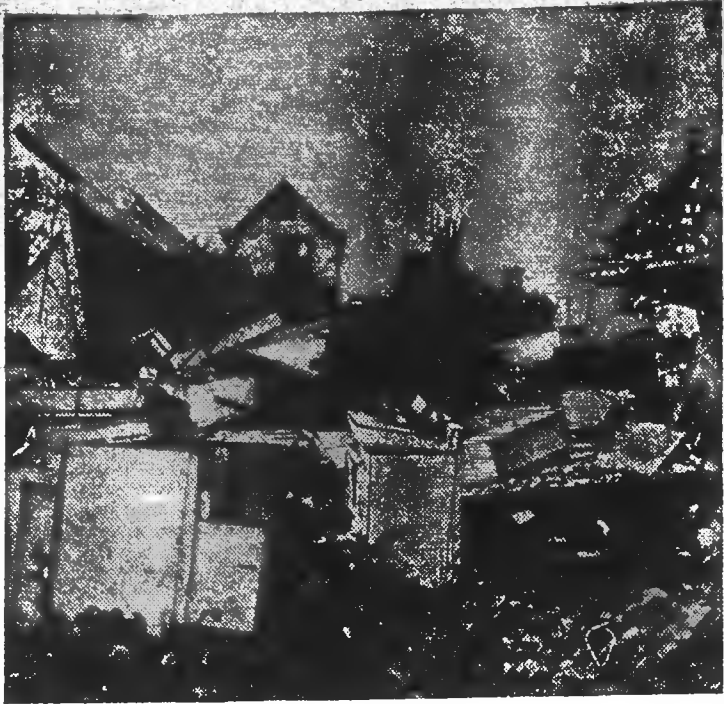
OUR BOYS WITH THE COLORS

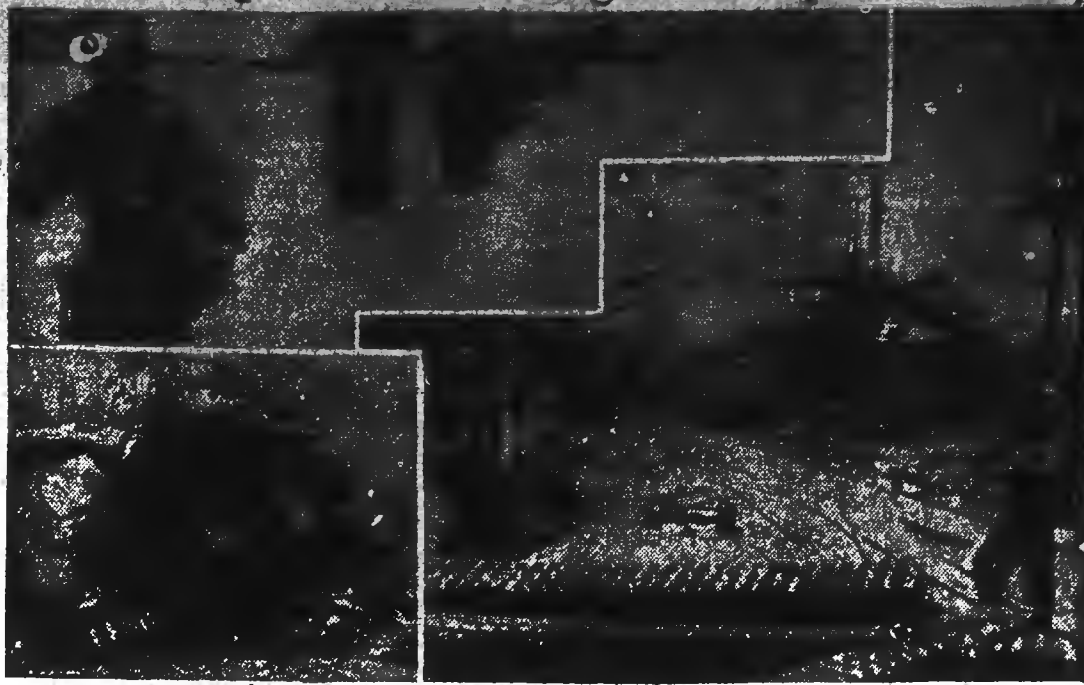
