Much confusion exists as to the procedure to be followed by retailers, wholesalers and other suppliers in depositing or transferring rationing currency. Banks in which suppliers have their accounts have been instructed to accept deposits of stamps and counons only if they are prepared in the manner outlined below:

1. When transferring or depositing 250 or less stamps—use REGISTERED GUERNSEY BULL gummed sheets-do not use enve-

2. When transferring or de-North Wilkesboro. Close to positing between 250 and 1000 Texaco Oil Plant. Service fee stamps-use either an envelope (Form R-132) or gummed sheets. 3. When transferring or de-


