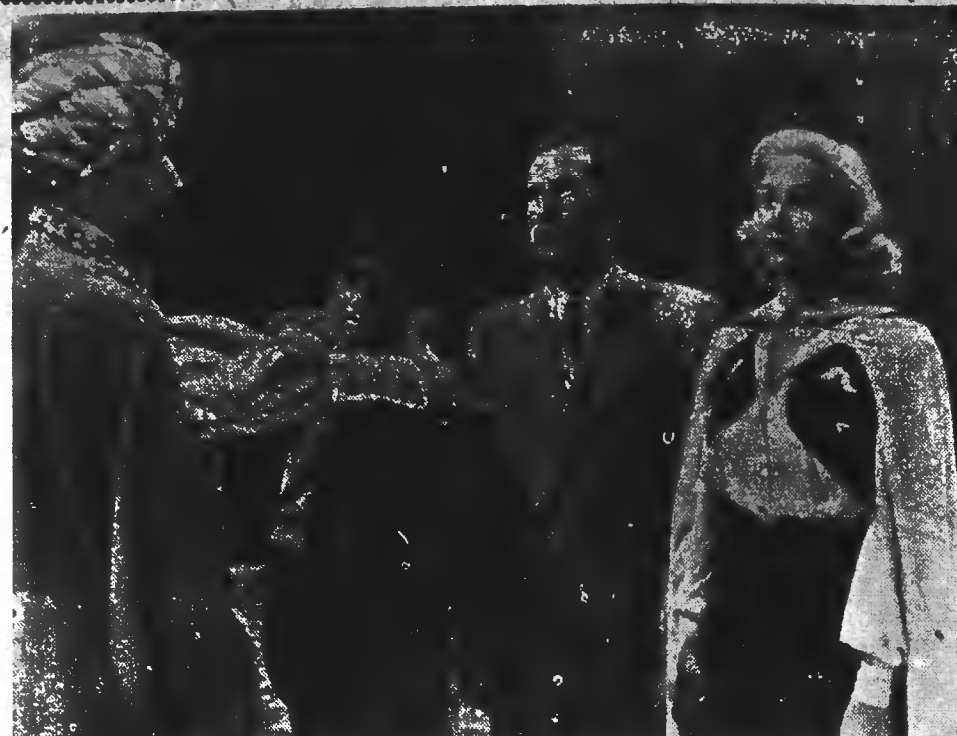


Interesting News From Deep Gap
