Pearl Harbor Navy Yard Seeks Many Skilled Workers

The Pearl Harbor Navy Yard, because of its continuing crucial need and because it is the strategic Pacific outpost in the war against Japan, has again been given the highest priority over all other recruiting programs by the U. S. Civil Service Commission, the Navy Department and War Manpower Commission, announced today.

Mr. Frank Worden, representative, said he could be contacted on Thursday, Friday and Saturday at North Wilkesboro. Mr. Worden said "the Navy Department has advised that the need for workers at Pearl Harbor navy yard is even more critical at the present time than it was in January of last year".

Urgently needed are electricians, aircraft mechanics, machinists, metalmiths, pipefitters and insulators, helpers of all kinds, laborers and many other skilled and semi-skilled workers. Appointees will have their transportation costs paid and are offered the opportunity of working at the Mare Island Navy Yard on the West Coast at the prevailing rate of pay plus an additional daily rate for subsistence, while awaiting arrangements to be shipped to Pearl Harbor. Upon arriving for duty, employees are guaranteed adequate housing at reasonable cost.

Recreation has been well provided for employees at Pearl Harbor. Baseball and football fields are located around all housing areas. The recreation hall provides a library, reading room, and an auditorium where indoor sports and movies are conducted. Several groups of musically minded employees have formed orchestras. Employees, if they wish, may bring along their favorite musical instruments.

Complete details regarding these vital war jobs at Pearl Harbor may be obtained from Mr. Worden at War Manpower Commission office in Duke Power Co. building.

Appointments will be made in accordance with War Manpower Commission policies and Employment Stabilization plans.

Mr. Worden said that there are also positions for all skilled and unskilled workers, who are physically qualified, at the Norfolk Navy Yard at Portsmouth, Va.

L. P. Phillips Is Taken By Death

L. Prevette Phillips, well known local citizen, died Wednesday morning, 6:30, at his home three miles west of this city. He had been in apparently normal health until Tuesday night, when he suffered a stroke from which he did not rally.

Mr. Phillips, age 59, was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Phillips, and spent practically all his life at North Wilkesboro, where for many years he was a foreman for Home Chair company.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Ada Pierce Phillips, two sons, Clyde and Bobby Phillips; one daughter, Mrs. Frank Henderson; two brothers, H. M. Phillips, of Wilkesboro, and Ralph L. Phillips, of Valdosta, Ga.; and one sister, Mrs. T. J. Frazier, of North Wilkesboro.

Funeral services for Mr. Phillips will be held Friday, 11 a. m., at Union Methodist church near his home.
