**MEATS, FATS**—Red stamps Q5, R5, S5, expire Mar. 31; red stamps T5, U5, V5, W5, X5 expire Apr. 28; red stamps Y5, Z5, and A2, B2, C2, D2 expire June 2.

**PROCESSED FOODS**—Blue stamps K5, Y5, Z5, and A7 and B2 expire Mar. 31; blue stamps C2, D2, E2, F2, and G2 expire Apr. 28; blue stamps H2, J2, K2, L2 and M2 expire June 2.

**SUGAR**—Stamp 34 expires Feb. 28; stamp 35 expires June 2.

**FUEL OIL**—East and Far West 1 and 2 period coupons good indefinitely. Period 3 coupons good indefinitely. Period 4 coupon in East will become good on January 15. Mid-West and South period 1, 2 and 3 coupons good throughout heating year.

**SHOES**—Airplane Stamps 1, 2, and 3 in Book Three, good indefinitely.

### Workers Wanted

Frank B. Worden, labor recruiter for the Norfolk Navy Yard, announced here today at the U. S. Employment Service office here that he is in a position to offer immediate employment to eligible men classified as 4-F and to other men who are not working in essential war work.

"Every man who can work has got to put his shoulder to the wheel", Mr. Worden said. "Pearl Harbor or the Norfolk Navy Yard is one place where a man can be sure he is doing a job for the war effort."

All types of workmen ranging from electricians and machinists to unskilled laborers are needed at the Navy Yards to help with Naval construction and repair, the recruiter said.

He stated that excellent wages are paid, that the Navy will pay transportation to where the yard is located, and that housing will be provided at reasonable cost. All the work is under Civil Service.

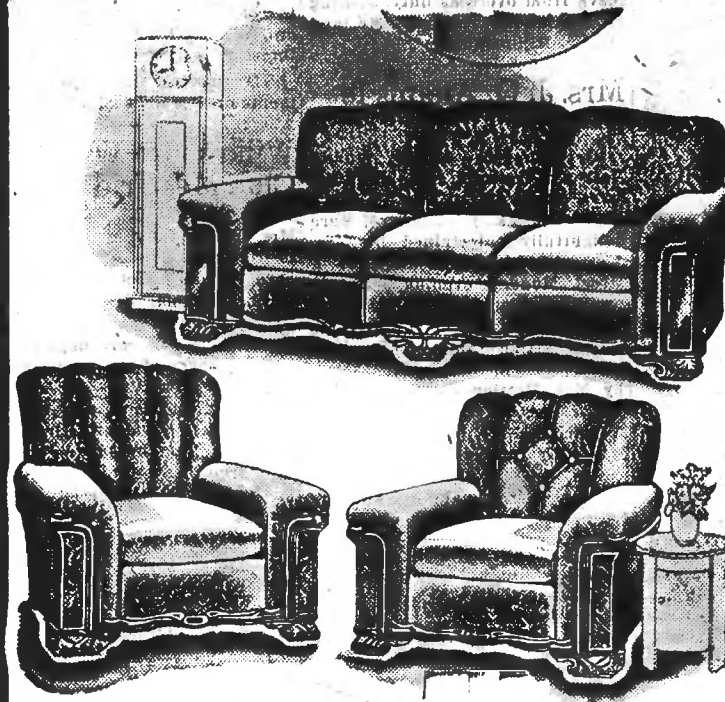

of Mrs. Graham in the Chingona community. Captain Graham has been commander of an army transport and at the end of his leave expects to resume his duties in that capacity.

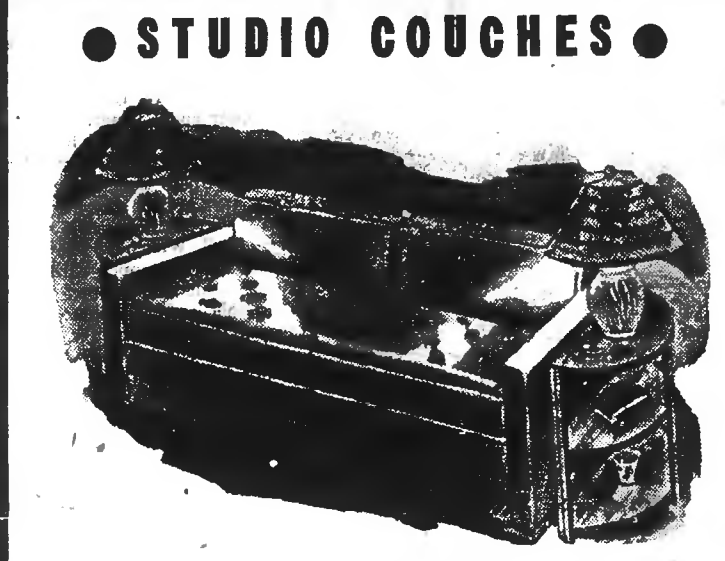

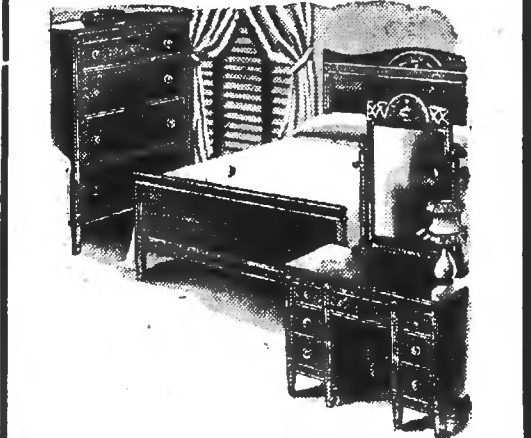
