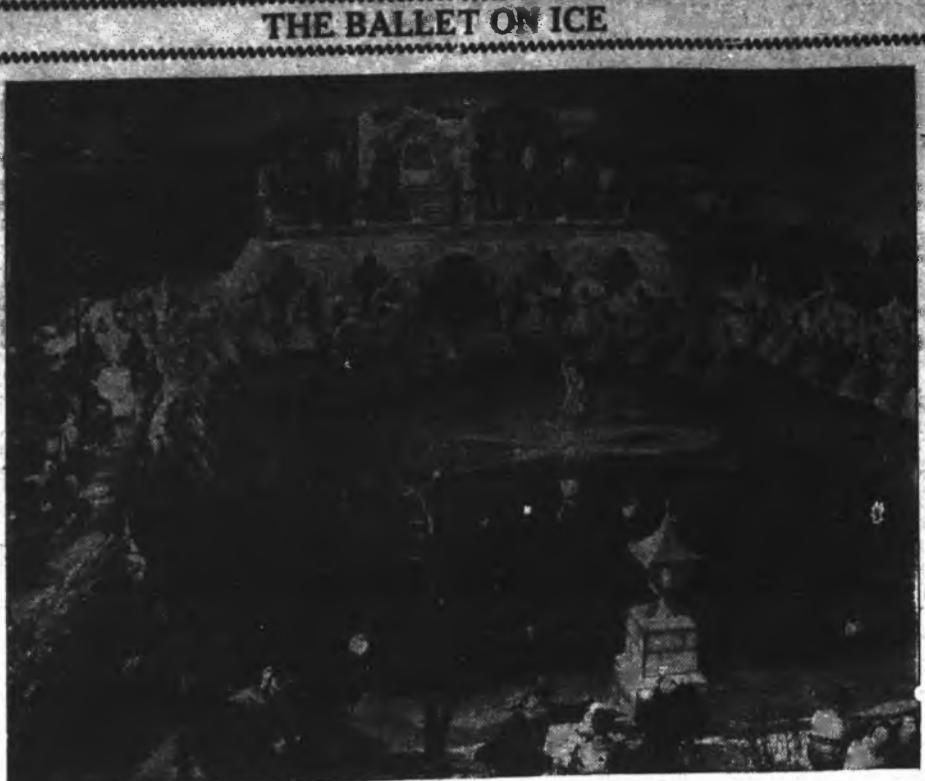

any service man who has been in foreign service to stir a mood of praise for the work the American Red Cross is doing. The Red Cross readers a variety of services, some of which we may have a tendency to overlook. One of the most impressive to me is the Red Cross clubs set up in many foreign cities. The average club consists of a lounge, which resembles a large hotel lobby, a reading room, a game room, and a "snack bar" with perhaps 20 or 25 tables serving coffee and sweet buns. Some clubs also provide a dining room which serves inexpensive meals, and some are equipped to furnish a night's lodging at very reasonable rates. The daily tours, conducted by many clubs, were of particular interest to me. The tours are entirely free. They cover points of historic interest and might be for a distance of 30 or 40 miles round trip. They not only furnish transportation but even throw in a guide. One in a strange land far from home could scarcely fail to appreciate such advantages.

And still another comment is the following paragraph from a letter by Pvt. Norman Ervin, of Fort Knox, Ky., to Mr. and Mrs. H. F. Bouknight:

"I never thought about the work that the Red Cross was doing until I came here. They don't get half the credit they deserve. I am using some of their ink now, and have been reading their books and magazines since I have been here. They send a lady around every day to run errands for you, get cigarettes or anything you need. You won't hear me ever say anything against them and when I do get out of the army I will give more to them than I ever did before. I have on a bathrobe and pajamas that they furnished and am listening to a phonograph that they put in our ward, so you see it would be a dull place without them."
