An Eighth Air Force Bomber Station, England, Technical Sergeant Jack E. Seckler, 20 of Kingsport, Tenn., has won the Air Medal for "outstanding achievement in aerial warfare, courage and skill" in aerial warfare. Sgt. Seckler is assigned and 799, turret gunner on a B-17 Flying Fortress participating in Eighth Air Force bombing attacks on targets in Nazi Germany.

He is a member of the 443 Bomb. Group, a unit of the Third Air Division, the division cited by the President for its now historic England-Africa shuttle bombing of Messerschmitt aircraft plants at Regensburg, Germany.

Sgt. Seckler is the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Seckler, 2800 Bristol Highway, Kingsport. A 1941 graduate of the North Wilkesboro high school, the sergeant was employed as an electrician by Robert Woolorton, Kingsport, before entering the Army Air Forces in January, 1943.
