Gambill had been in combat several weeks and was dispatching a message to another outfit at night over a road which was under shell fire from Germans only 300 yards distant. No lights were on the vehicle and he was traveling at high speed when a collision occurred with a dispatcher from the other outfit. In the collision Pvt. Gambill's leg was broken twice below the knee.
