Pre-School Clinic Here On Tuesday

The annual pre-school clinic will be held at North Wilkesboro school on Tuesday, May 3, beginning at 9:30 a. m. Parents are urged to bring or send their children to school on this day.

In announcing this clinic, Supt. Cragan said: "Children who will be six years old on or before Oct. 1, 1945, will be eligible to enter school next fall. All these children should have a complete physical examination on this day so that any defects discovered may be corrected before time for school to start."

"We desire also to point out," continued Mr. Cragan, "that laws passed by the recent state legislature require that all children must be vaccinated against small-pox and diphtheria before being allowed to attend the public schools. This pre-school clinic has been arranged to offer this service to all children who have not previously been vaccinated by the public health officer or by their family physician."

The full co-operation of all parents is requested by school officials in order that the health condition of all children in the community may be kept at the highest possible level.

Delivery Record Now Required By Non-Road Users

Local rationing officials are calling attention to the fact that a new gasoline regulation requires that users of non-highway gasoline keep a record of all purchases.

With non-highway coupons now being used out go blanks which detract from the gasoline line. Non-highway coupons will not be returned on receipt by the rationing board of the delivery record fully filled out.
