

Major General Paul W. Baade, Commanding General of the 35th Infantry Division, for heroic ser vice in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near Schalke, Germany, on April 5, 1945, with the following citation:

"While on outpost duty at 0200 nours, Private West heard foot- Marines. steps approaching his machine gun position. When the countersign was not given upon his challenge, he fired his weapon and wounded one of the enemy. They returned fire on the muzzle-flash of his carbine, but by then he was manning his machine gun. His heroic actions which induced an entire enemy patrol to surrender reflect credit upon his charac ter as a soldier."
