

Hope Hubbard to Be Recognized on National Hook-up

Asheboro, July 19.—Miss Hope Hubbard, of Farmer, on July 21 will be recognized by Tom Brennan and his Breakfast in Hollywood program as the nation's "good neighbor" of the day over a nation-wide hook-up, reads the following letter written by Mrs. Sue Morgan Denny, of Littleton, Route 2.

"Allow me to nominate Miss Hope Hubbard, of Farmer, N. C., for your good neighbor. After she became Girl Scout leader of a bunch of us girls, the boys of the community got a notion they wanted a troop also. They could not get a Scoutmaster, so, rather than see them lose the opportunity, she became the boys' leader too. She trained them as hard as if she had been a man, blues, camping and all the rest. She and her father (the late Dr. C. C. Hubbard, one of Randolph county's oldest, both from points of service and age, practicing physicians) and mother operated a lending library from the books they had accumulated over the years. There was no charge and

did we enjoy these books! "There is no knowing how many telephone calls she delivered free to all people of the community, how many seeds and flower bulbs she has given away, or how many sick she has visited. After her father, who was a country doctor, became unable to drive, she chauffeured him over every kind of road at any hour of the day or night.

"All these years she has had other things to do besides neighborly. She has 'talked' churned, hoed, washed and ironed for her family for a number of years. She has taught school for several years and belongs to the Business and Professional Woman's Club (Asheboro) and has held state offices in the Friends church. How about it? Is she a good neighbor?"

Miss Hubbard has consistently served as chairman of various fund drives in the farmer community and is generally considered the one source of information about anybody or anything in the community.

Two Million To Lack Jobs

Washington—The War Manpower Commission reported Saturday that cutbacks in war production since V-E Day will lift the nation's unemployment total to the 2,000,000 mark by August 1. This will be an increase of 1,000,000 over the June 1 figure. On that date, only 2,000,000 men and women were out of work in the entire country.

WMC is not worried about the sudden increase in unemployment, however. It expects most of the jobs to be absorbed in reconversion production. From August until Nov. 1, about 700,000 unemployed are expected to return to work in reconverted industries and expanded civilian activities.

Rationing Data Of Interest Here

Steps have been taken by OPA to equalize egg prices charged by retail sellers with community dollar-and-cent prices charged in stores, it was announced yesterday by Dr. A. District Director L. W. Driscoll.

Formerly, mark-ups on eggs sold by retail route sellers, producers and all sellers except retail stores, were based on current prices. These sellers will now apply their mark-ups to the preceding week's prices, the same method used in establishing community dollar-and-cent prices, Mr. Driscoll said.

The new pricing methods are intended to apply primarily to processors and wholesalers of eggs and egg products.

Passenger Tire Eligibility Regulations governing the eligibility of motorists for grade 1 passenger tires have been readjusted; it was announced in Charlotte by District Director Driscoll.

In the future, motorists using their cars for a bona fide change of residence for which they have been issued special gasoline rationing, will be eligible for the certificates.

Driscoll said the change was designed primarily for the following three groups:

1. War workers moving from one city to another as production shifts from one type of war goods to another or shifts to civilian commodities.
 2. Members of the armed forces moving to a new post.
 3. Discharged veterans returning home or moving to another city to accept a job.
- Formerly, Mr. Driscoll said, issuance of new tire certificates was limited largely to persons holding supplemental gasoline rations. The new provision will bridge this gap in the regulations, Mr. Driscoll added.

Bogus Shoe Stamps

Taking steps to curb the increasing number of counterfeit shoe coupons coming into the Charlotte area, Driscoll said yesterday that the agency is launching an enforcement drive against dealers accepting bogus stamps.

"The use of these phonies can be successful only when merchants accept loose stamps," Driscoll declared.

In order to be legally acceptable, shoe stamps must be torn from the war ration book in the presence of the merchant or his employee, Driscoll asserted.

He pointed out also that enforcement action would be taken against merchants found in violation, adding that this would entail suspension of their right to deal in rationed shoes.

Banana Order Postponed It now appears as though July 28 may be the "Yes, we have some bananas," according to announcement by the OPA district director.

Mr. Driscoll said that the OPA regulation effective date on ripened Mexican bananas had been postponed until then. Originally, the order was scheduled to take effect earlier.

The postponement seemed advisable, the director added, to give wholesalers ample time to dispose of bananas bought at higher prices.

Low-Cost Clothing OPA has made several price adjustments in order to assure plenty

of low-priced woolen and knit goods clothing for the nation during the coming winter, it has been disclosed.

Knit cotton and woolen hosiery, underwear and outer garments are all affected. The actions include restrictions on jobbers.

A temporary increase in the amount of herringbone twill is expected as a result of the joint efforts of OPA and the War Production Board.

Wholesalers and retailers of heavyweight cotton knitted underwear will be required to share the absorption of increases in manufacturers' prices for these goods rather than wholesalers carrying the whole load under the adjusted program.
