Sparta—Fifteen hundred persons filled the Sparta First Baptist church to overflowing yesterday as this town of 700 paid its last respects to Mrs. Robert L. Doughton, wife of the veteran congressman from the Ninth North Carolina District. Fog and rain prevented many living in rural sections from attending.

Prominent national and state political figures joined townspeople in a final farewell to the former Miss Lillie Strickler, a native of Concord, who rose to a position high in Washington society. Mrs. Doughton died in a capital hospital Thursday.

Harold Knutson, Republican Representative from Minnesota, and John H. Fogler, Democratic Congressman from Mt. Airy, represented the House, where Rep. Doughton has served without interruption for three decades.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. S. G. Walker, pastor of the Sparta First Baptist church, assisted by Rev. C. R. Allison, First Methodist church pastor at Sparta, and Rev. E. W. Thompson, pastor of the Sparta First Presbyterian church.

Burial was in the cemetery at Laurel Springs, ten miles from here. The Doughton summer home is in Laurel Springs.

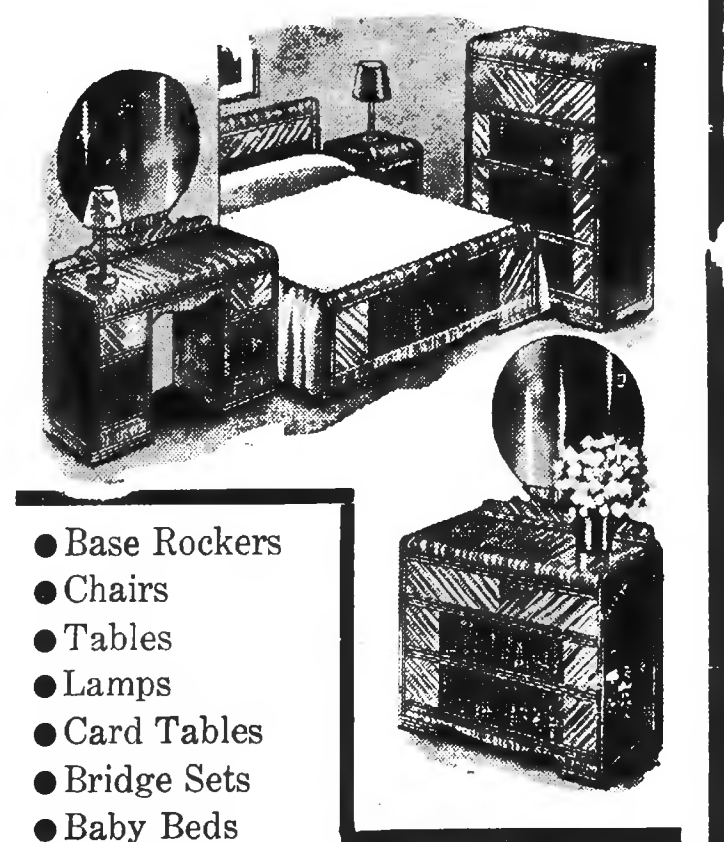
