Grand Niece Dr. And Mrs. Combs Dies In a Wreck

Dr. and Mrs. Gilbert R. Combs, of this city, received a telegram Saturday conveying the news that their grand niece, Judith Morris, had died as a result of an automobile wreck which took place Friday.

The following account of the accident is taken from the Saturday issue of the Lexington (Ky.) Herald:

Funeral services for Judith Combs Morris, 3, daughter of Mrs. Vivian C. Morris 1209 Richmond road and R. E. Morris, North Broadway, were to be held at 2:30 p. m. today at the W. R. Milward mortuary chapel, the Rev. Albert G. Stone officiating. Burial was to be in the Lexington cemetery.

The child died at 8:43 o'clock Friday night at the Good Samaritan hospital, less than three hours after she was struck by an automobile driven by Wilford W. Hopkins, 27, of 607-C South Blue Grass park. Hopkins was charged with manslaughter and was released on \$1,000 bond. His case was transferred to Fayette County Court when he appeared in police court today.

Deputy Coroner James L. Chasteen said death was due to a fractured skull, a broken neck and internal injuries, and that the child did not regain consciousness after being admitted to the hospital. He said no inquest would be held.

Hopkins told Patrolmen Adam Dean and Gilbert Cravens he was driving west on the Richmond road at a speed of approximately 30 miles an hour when the child ran in front of his car. He said he stopped immediately. The officers expressed the belief that a wheel of the car passed over the child.

Officers said the child had been playing in the front yard of her home immediately before the accident and apparently had run

down an embankment into the path of the car. She was taken to the hospital by Hopkins and James Atkins, Taxes Creek, a passing motorist. In the car with Hopkins at the time of the accident, officers stated, were his wife and their two small children.

The child's death was the 16th traffic fatality in Fayette county this year and the second this week.

Besides her parents, the child is survived by her maternal grandfather, S. B. Combs, and a sister, Mary Margaret Morris, both of Lexington.

The body was taken to the W. R. Milward mortuary chapel.
