## CARS GIVEN TO VETS WHO LOST LIMBS IN WAR

D. Clyde Beshears and John W. Minton, veterans who lost legs in action, have been delivered automobiles by Gaddy Motor company in this city.

L. Harold Yountz, in charge of the Veterans Administration office here, said that Messrs. Beshears and Minton were the first local men to receive cars given by the government and were the 14th and 15th in the state.

Under provisions of an act of congress, any veteran who lost a leg or the use of a leg (above the ankle), may be provided with an automobile, the total cost not to exceed \$1,600.

Mr. Yountz explained that veterans who qualify can make application through the Veterans Administration office here and that the applications will be handled promptly.

Already 25 veterans in this community have filed applications through the North Wilkesboro office and have been approved. All except the two mentioned above are on waiting lists for automobiles from dealers.
