

### Patrolmen Will Check Failure to Dim Lights

Raleigh, Dec. 3.—Highway patrolmen have been ordered to concentrate on drivers who fail to dim their headlights when meeting approaching cars, Maj. H. J. Hatcher, commander of the state highway patrol, said today.

Hatcher said that glaring lights are responsible for many accidents, since the lights often blind oncoming drivers. "Common, everyday courtesy demands that drivers dim their lights," Hatcher said. Failure to dim lights is a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of up to \$10 or up to 10 days in jail.
