a misdemeanor. Suspension Upon Conviction of Certain Offenses

The Commissioner must revoke the license of any person who has been convicted in North Carolina or elsewhere of (1) voluntary or involuntary manslaughter, (2) driving an automobile while under the influence of liquor or drugs, (3) perjury or making a false affidavit to the department of Motor Vehicles, (4) any crime punishable as a felony under our Motor Vehicle laws, (5) two charges of reckless driving, (6) failure to stop at the scene of an accident resulting in bodily injury. The Commissioner may, after hearing, suspend the license of any person who, in his judgment, is incompetent to drive a motor vehicle, or is habitually a reckless or negligent driver.

Suspension For Failure To Pay Judgment
The Commissioner shall suspend the operator's license and registration plates of any person who has failed to pay a judgment resulting from an accident involving bodily injury or damage to property in excess of \$50.00. The suspension of license and registration plates shall continue until the judgment is paid. The automobile involved shall not be re-registered in the name of any person so long as the Commissioner has reason to believe that to re-register the automobile would have the effect of defeating the purpose of the law.

A judgment shall be deemed satisfied after it is paid in full or if \$5,000 has been paid in the event of injury to one person or \$10,000 has been paid in the event of injury to more than one person or in the event \$1,000 has been paid in connection with a property damage loss.

What Constitutes Proof of Financial Responsibility
Proof of financial responsibility means proof of ability to pay damages for liability thereafter incurred in the amount of \$5,000 for injury to one person, \$10,000 for injury to two or more persons and \$1,000 for property damage.

How To Furnish Proof of Financial Responsibility
Proof of financial responsibility may be furnished through the purchase of an automobile liability policy with limits as indicated in the preceding section or by posting cash, securities, or corporate bond in the amount of \$11,000 with the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles.

Penalty For Operating Automobile While Under Suspension
Any person whose license or registration has been suspended or revoked who operates an automobile shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and will, upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment for not less than two days and not more than six months and be fined not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00, either or both.

Assigned Risk Plan
For the benefit of those who are unable to secure automobile insurance through ordinary methods the proposed statute provides for the operation of an Assigned Risk Plan. The details of this plan are too numerous to be covered in this digest. Briefly stated, The Assigned Risk Plan provides that if an individual cannot buy automobile liability insurance, upon application to the Commissioner of Insurance his risk may be assigned to an insurance carrier doing business in the State of North Carolina.
