**Carrier Exam At Wilkesboro**

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination to fill the position of rural carrier at Wilkesboro, North Carolina.

The examination will be held at Wilkesboro.

Receipt of applications will close on March 20, 1947.

The date of examination will be stated on admission cards mailed to applicants after the closing date for receipt of applications, and will be about 15 days after that date.

The salary of a rural carrier on a standard daily route of 30 miles is \$2020 a year, with an additional \$20 a mile a year for each mile or major fraction thereof in excess of 30 miles.

Rural carriers shall be promoted successively at the beginning of the quarter following one

year's satisfactory service in each grade to the next higher grade until they reach the 11th grade (for a standard 30-mile daily route, an increase of \$84 a year is provided in each grade, through grade 11). Carriers who perform faithful and meritorious service shall be promoted to grade 12 after three years of such service in grade 11, and shall be promoted to grade 13 after five years of such service in grade 12, and shall be promoted to grade 14 after seven years of such service in grade 13. (Public Law 134, 79th Congress of July 8, 1945).

The examination will be open to citizens of, or persons who owe allegiance to, the United States, who are actually residing in the territory of the Post Office where the vacancy exists; who have been actually residing there for one year next preceding the closing date for receipt of applications, and who meet the other requirements set forth in Form 1977 of July 1946. Both men and women, if qualified, may enter this examination, but appointing officers have the legal right to specify the sex desired in requesting certification of eligibles.

Form 1977 and application blanks can be obtained from the vacancy office mentioned above or from the United States Civil Service Commission at Washington 25, D. C. Applications must be on file with the Commission at Washington 25, D. C., prior to

Whereas the American National Red Cross, traditional friend and counselor of the serviceman and the veteran, furnishes comfort and renewed hope to our sick and wounded in hospitals, and provides morale-building welfare and recreational facilities for our occupation forces abroad as well as a wide range of services to those returning to civilian life in this country; and Whereas the Red Cross, chartered by Congress and equipped by experience to cope with human needs when disaster strikes, performs its errands of mercy with skill and expedition; and Whereas the Red Cross is devoting increased attention to its home-nursing and first aid programs which are designed through training courses to check the spread of disease and to reduce the frightful toll of accidents; and Whereas this organization is entirely dependent upon the voluntary contributions of the people of the United States in rendering these services, and has estimated that a minimum fund of \$60,000,000 will be necessary to the close of business on the date specified above.
