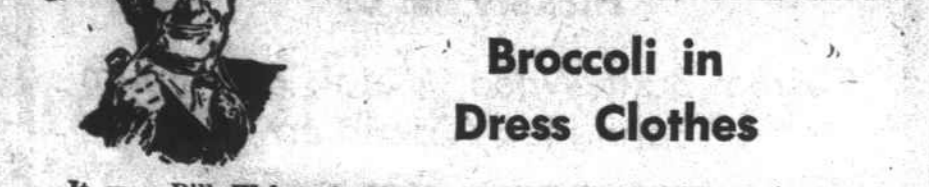
Singing On Sunday At Round Mountain
