River Dam Survey Is Slated to Begin

War Department Engineers Have Funds For Topo-graphical Surveys

Initial surveys on the proposed Yadkin Valley flood control project are slated to begin this week.

The work to be done now will include topographical surveys of dam sites in anticipation of actual construction when an appropriation can be obtained through a future session of congress.

A planning fund of \$75,000 has been set aside for the work, and army engineers announced that they would proceed with the sarveys on the dam sites sometime next week. It is expected that topographic surveys of the two proposed Reddies River sites will be completed first.
