AN ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Issuance of \$5,500 of Bonds of The Town of North Wilkesboro For the Improvement of Public Streets.
BE IT ORDAINED by the Board

of Commissioners of the Town of North Wilkesboro, as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the Town of North Wilkesboro has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that said Town construct or reconstruct the surface of public streets in said Town and contemporaneously grade such streets and construct or reconstruct thereon sidewalks, curbs, gutters and drains, and that it will be necessary to expend for said purpose ner as president and Mrs. W. P. Bumgarner as secretary-treasurnot less than \$5,500.

Section 2 . Said Board of Commissioners has also ascertained and hereby determines that the purpose hereinbefore described is a necessary expense of said Town within the meaning of Section 7 of Article VII of the Constitution of current expense of said Town.

Section 3. In order to raise the money required for such purpose, bonds of the Town of North Wilkesboro are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, 1921 of North Carolina. Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under said Act, and, in such event, it shall take effect when approved


