A and B Drivers Must Get License To Drive By 31st

Drivers whose last names begin with A or B are reminded that they have only until December 31 to obtain new operators' license. Motorists caught driving after that time without new license will be subject to a fine of \$25, even though they may have old license, since the offense will be equivalent to driving without license.

Automobile operators who take the test and fall are not disqualified from obtaining driving permits. A second or third test will be given applicants if necessary.
