Social Security payments are made to working people over 65 who have retired from covered employment and to widows, children, parents, and other relatives of working people who have died. Sometimes the payments are monthly, and sometimes a lumpsum payment is made. But in every case, the payments must be applied for before they can be received. "We are here to serve the people and to see that they are paid," Louis H. Clement, manager of the Salisbury office said in an interview today, "but we can't go to the people-they must come to us."
