Mr. Sanges, a former baseball player and coach, will begin his duties with the boys following close of school here.

Legion junior baseball was inaugurated in Wilkes last year with a team in regular competition. The boys, many of whom were playing their first baseball, played the entire season and gained valuable experience, although they lost a majority of games played. High spot of the season was the Wilkes team's victory over Charlotte.

The committee in meeting on Monday night deferred other plans for the season because instructions had not been received from state headquarters of schedule, eligibility, district groupings and other matters.
