Mrs. R. G. Call, of Moravian Falls, visited her mother, Mrs. A. R. Yates, one day last week.

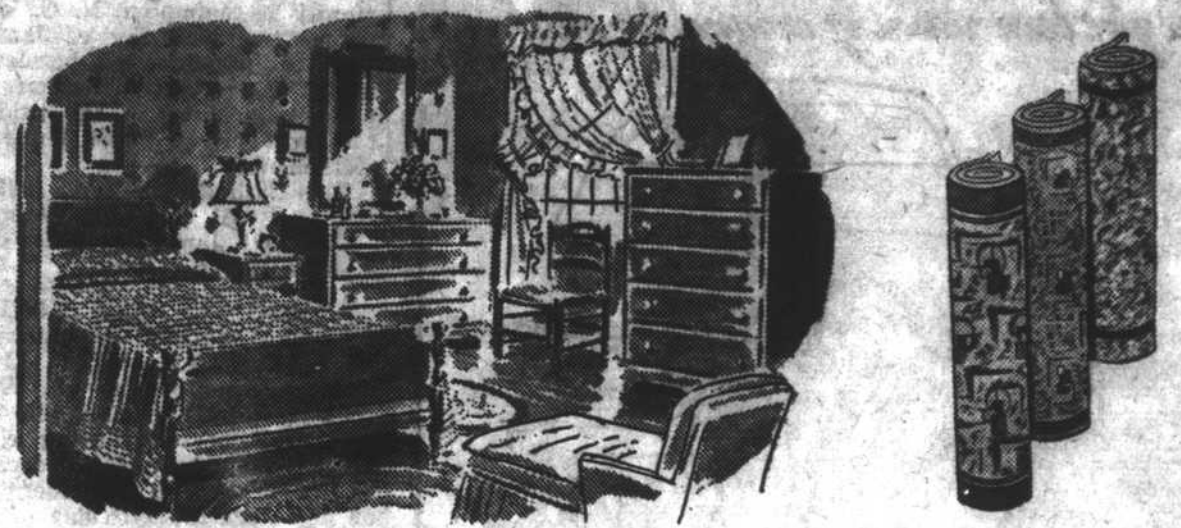
