

Heavy Penalties Are Meted Out In lov. Term Court

Heavy fines and prison sentences were meted out in federal court in Wilkesboro Wednesday by Judge Johnson J. Hayes to defendants with records in manufacture and distribution of illicit liquor.

Joseph Gwyn Foster and Julius Harold Call, of North Wilkesboro route three, were fined \$1,000 each and given 15 months in prison in one liquor case. In another Foster was fined \$500 and given 15 months suspended and a term on probation. Arvel and James Pruitt, of Trap-

hill, received the heaviest fines. In one case Arvel Pruitt was fined \$3,000 and sentenced to 18 months in Atlanta. In two cases James Pruitt was required to pay a total of \$3,000 in fines and penalties and was sentenced to two years in Atlanta prison.


