**W. S. Blankenship Dies In Alexander**  
W. Sherrill Blankenship, age 87, a prominent, well known retired farmer, and one of the oldest citizens of Alexander county, died noon Thursday, January 13, in Hickory Memorial Hospital at Hickory. He had been in failing health for several months but was critically ill only a few days prior to his death.

Mr. Blankenship was born August 13, 1861, the son of the late James A. Blankenship and the late Annie Sherrill Blankenship. He lived his entire life in Alexander county except a few years spent in the Western States in his early life.

He is survived by his wife, the former Miss Ada E. Johnson, two daughters: Miss Esple Blankenship of the home, and Miss Melo Blankenship, manager of Western Union Telegraph office, North Wilkesboro; two brothers: A. J. Blankenship, Statesville, and M. M. Blankenship of Alexander county.

Funeral services were held 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon at Sulphur Springs Baptist church where he had been a member since early life. Services were conducted by the pastor, Rev. Grady White, and interment was in the church cemetery.

The beautiful and numerous floral offerings were carried by relatives and friends.
