

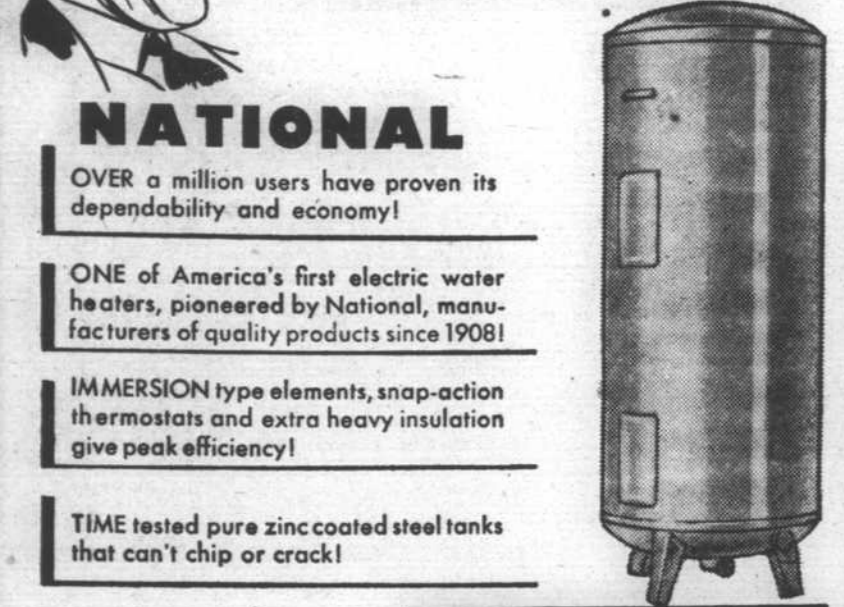

ELKIN — Charles Gray Armfield, formerly Mayor of Elkin, died at 3:20 p. m. Tuesday in Winston-Salem where he had been under special treatment during a long illness. Mr. Armfield was reared in Statesville a son of Robert Edward and Alice Gray Armfield. He moved to Elkin when a young man. He was a charter member and first president of the Elkin Kiwanis Club was once Mayor of Elkin and vice-president of the former Elkin National Bank. He was also a member of the Board of Stewards of the Elkin Methodist Church and served in this capacity later at Greensboro, Roanoke, Va., and Fredrick, Md. For the past 15 years he had been a bank examiner for the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, making his home in Frederick, Md.

RALEIGH — (AP) — Writing the death certificate of motor vehicle inspection. Speaker Kerr J. Craig Ramsay tonight voiced hope that something like it will be enacted.

When he put his signature on the inspection repealer passed by the General Assembly last week and thus ratified it, he told the house he hoped that some legislation which would keep some of the good features of inspection would be enacted at this session. A move to revive inspection will be pushed this week.

Senator L. H. Foundation of Edgecombe, who introduced a new inspection bill last week, said he was winding up work on amendments to his measure and would have them ready to present at the senate roads committee's next session.
