The part of the wife is taken by Nellie Gabriel and the Silent Partner is Ivey Moore.

The second play is "Judge Not," a drama. The play is the story of an elderly woman of German origin—the part is taken by Mrs. John Baitz—has had her hand taken from her by the government. She is resentful when her granddaughter (Harriet Crutchfield) a school teacher, brings home an American flag to mend. Grandma hides it. ## Latter-Day Saints Missionaries Here

Two fulltime missionaries of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints have been assigned to labor in North Wilkesboro according to an announcement today by Truman F. Clawson, Supervising Elder of the North Carolina West District of the Central Atlantic States Mission of the Church.

Elder Paul L. Martin from Utah and Elder Theron Gambles from Idaho will be assigned to labor in North Wilkesboro indefinitely.

The missionary system of the church is unique in that the missionaries, usually young men and women, serve for a period of approximately two years without any pay. At the present there are 5,000 Latter-Day Saint volunteer missionaries throughout the world. Approximately 120 are now laboring in the states of Virginia and North Carolina. The missionaries have no formal schooling in the gospel but rely solely upon that which they acquire in their mission field experiences and by constant study. It is the application of the old adage, "We learn best by doing."
