SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 28.—(AP)—The chief reason for failure in child rearing, said a Duke University specialist today may be described in three blunt words: "D. . . fool parents."

The speaker was Dr. Leslie B. Hohman, neuropsychiatrist and author of numerous texts on child behavior. He was participating in a question and answer session at the conference of the International Council for Exceptional Children.

"They won't let you teach until you have had a good education," he remarked, "but you can have children with not a day of education."
