gave assistance in more domestic disaster operations than in any zation's 67-year history, chapter officials here pointed out in reviewing the agency's primary

In 61 Red Cross disaster operations during the 24-month period a total of \$16,852,309 was spent for relief and rehabilitation. In the 1947-48 fiscal year \$12-171.022 was expended in 303 di-Easter relief operations while in the previous year 316 relief operations cost the Red Cross \$4,-681,287, the chapter reported. Since the American Red Cross was founded in 1881 it has spent \$139,000,000 in 3,954 domestic

disaster operations, it was added. The Red Cross today is better able than ever before to cope with catastrophe and subsequent rehabilitation, chapter officials said. The country is covered by a network of chapters with programs of disaster preparedness and re-

With cooperation of community leaders they are ready to act quickly and effectively in warning, rescue, and evacuation; in providing medical and nursing aid, food, shelter and clothing the spokesman said.

Also cited was development of a growing blood reserve; a system of amateur radio communications soon to be in operation; and ability of the organization to mobilize large numbers of nurses quickly.


