most favorable to new growth. Today thanks to a forwardlooking forest policy on the part of both industry and the public, North Carolina's wood acreage is actually on the increase. Tree production is being further encouraged by the Tree Farm program started here in 1944. The Tree Farm System, like Keep America Green, is sponsored nationally by American Forest representing the Nation's major wood-using industries. Nearly half of North Carolina's commercial forest land is held by small farmers, who each

year harvest 50 million dollars worth of wood. Tree growing is an integral part of North Carolina agriculture and more and more farmers are learning trees are a crop that can be harvested not once or twice in a lifetime but year after year. It is estimated that the stump-

age value of North Carolina's standing timber, computed at current prices, is nearly 400 million dollars. While our state has only 9 percent of the South's commercial forest land area, it boasts 12 percent of the South's total wood volume. A major reason for this favorable condition is our state's

ability to produce wood faster than it is used. While growth and drain figures for commercial forests are nearing a balance, nationally, the margin, largely be-
